

## Notes from February 21st Unfounded Story

### Police Recommendations

Questions :

1. How are cases being reviewed
2. What will happen if cases re-opened
3. Can you provide disaggregate stats of identities of unfounded cases
4. Will LPS do reviews prior to 2010? If survivor came forward and wants review before 2010, what would happen?

Requests:

1. “Bill of Rights” = have an advocate sit in = active offer. Better to call it Protocols and make it a required police practice
2. Deadlines & regular public reporting by Chief on what is being done.
3. Implement Philadelphia Model
4. Police training against Rape Myths –Long term effects (not only physical)
  - Community experts be involved in development & delivery of LPS training

### Community Recommendations:

1. Other pathways for survivors beyond judicial - need to pursue
2. Community pressure to top of school board to have sexual violence prevention training across board - Coordinating Committee to look at this
3. OCRCC host Provincial Conference on mobilizing community groups
4. Commitment by City on Sexual Violence
  1. Community Diversity & Inclusion Strategy: gap on gender and violence, provide feedback through [www.engagelondon.ca](http://www.engagelondon.ca)
  2. Request delegation status to Diversity, Inclusion and Anti-Oppression Advisory Committee(DIAAC) or directly to Council. Provide suggestion on what action needs to be taken
  3. Request meeting with the Mayor and request he make strong stand.
  4. Put City, coordinating committee together made up of diverse groups and representation, along with the Police. Together create community plan
    - Preceded by Community Outreach meeting
      - Invite Chief and Police Services Board
      - Urban League could host with community experts lead
